

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR THE 2021/2022 ACADEMIC YEAR

Dear Students,

The 2021/2022 academic year has just started, and by welcoming you back into the classroom after so many months of lockdown, we are taking the first few steps towards a return to pre-pandemic normality.

Although current public health guidelines have allowed us to plan for a return to in-person, onsite learning for the year ahead, all of us, both individually and collectively, still need to remain vigilant and comply with a series of regulations designed to ensure that ESCI-UPF offers a safe environment for carrying out teaching activities as normally as possible.

How should I behave inside the building?

- You may not enter the building if you have a high temperature or any other symptoms compatible with Covid-19.
- Facemasks that securely cover your nose and mouth must be worn throughout the entire time you are inside the building. You should always carry a spare facemask with you at all times.
- Keep a safe distance from other people and follow the health guidelines set out by the public health and educational authorities.
- You should wash your hands regularly and use plenty of hand sanitiser, especially when you first arrive at the building and when you change classroom.
- Do not move the tables and chairs. They have been specifically arranged to keep students at a safe distance.
- Follow the signs indicating how to enter, leave and make your way around the building.
- You may use the water fountains in the building to refill your own personal drinking bottles, but you may not drink from them directly.
- Please keep a safe distance from others and do not exceed the maximum permitted number of people in the bar and on the terrace.
- Please remember that smoking is not permitted on the terrace.

- Take particular care when sharing personal objects (pens, computer mice, pen drives, etc.).
- You may use the reading and study room, but you must follow the safety guidelines and wear a facemask at all times

What should I do if ...?

- If you test positive for Covid-19, you must self-isolate and follow the public health guidelines. You should also inform your tutor, the Inclusion Office (inclusio@esci.upf.edu) and the head of Covid-19-related issues at ESCI-UPF (infocovid@esci.upf.edu).
- If you have been in close contact with someone with Covid-19 and you are not fully vaccinated (Pfizer: 7 days after your second jab; Moderna and AstraZeneca: 14 days after your second jab; Jansen: 14 days after your single jab), you must self-isolate, follow the public health guidelines and inform your tutor, the Inclusion Office (inclusio@esci.upf.edu) and the head of Covid-19-related issues at ESCI-UPF (infocovid@esci.upf.edu).
- If you have been in close contact with someone with Covid-19 and you are fully vaccinated, you do not need to self-isolate. But you must contact the Catalan Health Service (Salut) to arrange a PCR or antigen test. You should also wear a facemask at all times, check for the appearance of any symptoms compatible with Covid-19, avoid contact with vulnerable people and keep your social interaction to a minimum.
